

## INFORMATION ON HEATING IN THE HALL

### HOT WATER

KITCHEN – hot water comes from the wall mounted boiler in the kitchen. It provides “instant” hot water. There is also a water boiler above the worktop for tea/coffee etc. See separate instructions on the wall by it

DRESSING ROOM, TOILETS AND UPSTAIRS – Hot water comes from the wall mounted boiler in the disabled toilet

### ROOM HEATING

UPSTAIRS AND REAR OF BUILDING – central heating controlled by the wall mounted boiler in the disabled toilet. The programme has been set to match the normal programme of use. If the heating goes off or hasn't come on for any reason, you can override/extend it by pressing one of the buttons on the small override box to the right hand side of the boiler. The upstairs room temperature is controlled by a pre-set thermostat, set to maintain the room temperature at 20°C.

MAIN HALL – the Hall is heated by two wall mounted units. These operate as both heaters and air conditioning. The programme has been set to match the normal programme of use. There is no thermostat. The temperature has been set for 20°C – above which the air conditioning will be triggered, and below which the heating will come on. The system is a Heat Exchange unit. The programme and temperature can be altered but only by approved people. If the heating/air conditioning goes off or hasn't come on for any reason, you can override/extend it by pressing one of the buttons on the small override box to the left of the wall mounted control box above the fire alarm unit on the wall beside the door leading to the toilets.
